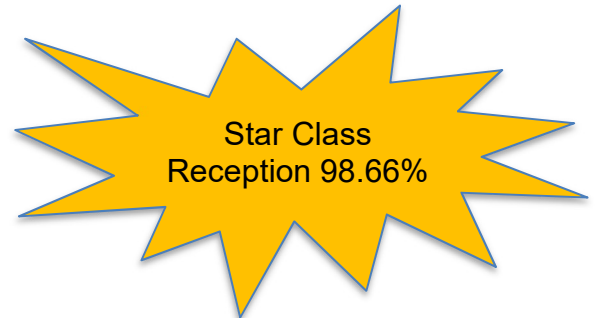
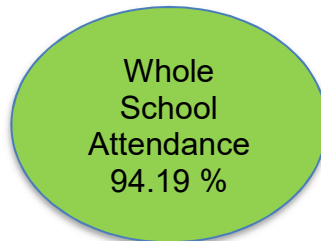
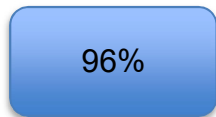

The children are working on some key Forest School skills during sessions such as compassion, teamwork, perseverance, support, empathy and multi-tasking. These key skills will help them as they start to move on to practical skills like fire lighting and tool work. Key stage 2 has taken it all in their stride and have been shelter building, bicycle building, cooking and even a musical set from a very talented drummer in year 6!

Claire's Wow moment from this week was watching two fantastic members of class 5 showing a massive amount of resilience, perseverance, team work and skill sharing when they spent their session putting up a new swing. They even recruited a third member to be the 'tester'. The swing took them over an hour to construct leaving them little time to enjoy what they had made. 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
## Healthy Heart Cardiac Event

Monday 17<sup>th</sup> June, 10am – 2pm, the school will be having staff from the George Elliot Hospital NHS Trust, they will be here to complete a free service to staff and parents/carers where they can do general checks. These checks will be for those over the age of 18 as a consent form will be required to be filled out.

The checks will be height, weight and blood pressure measured and a cholesterol check completed. The cholesterol check will require a small finger prick, once these tests have all been completed the team will go over a short questionnaire and then they will discuss the results.

There is limited spaces available, so please book in with the office if you would like to have your health checked on Monday, and the office can arrange time slots.
