Design a Lab Coat Competition



Each class came up with their own way to investigate this and it was brilliant to see what each class did and what they found out. The children put their graphing skills to the test drawing pictograms, bar graphs and scatter graphs.

Year 2 took part in **Science Farm Live** by the NFU looking at the ways that animals and crops are adapted to their habitats here

in Britain and the ways that some British farmers are adapting their practice to fight against climate change.

Year 4 took part in **Adapting to Life Beneath the Waves** by the Manta Trust looking at some of the incredible strategies marine creatures use to overcome challenges in their habitats and uncover the impact of environmental changes on the marine environment.
